This document is a membership application for the National States Rights Party from the FBI's report completed in 1970. It describes the party's beliefs in the efforts to convince white Americans to join the party. In 1960, the party's presidential candidate, Arkansas Governor Orval Faubus, received about 44,000 votes (about 0.1% of all votes cast).
